Shoulder coming in this morn-

-ing prevented my finishing the conversation which  
Lord Montfort's affair had brought on. I really cannot  
express to Lord Grenville for his kindness and his obli-  
-gions have regularly and systematically refused every  
thing I have requested and in relating the circumstances  
-went to Mr. Mahon he tells me that except in the single  
instance of Longchamp being made a Lieutenant in  
the Navy you have experienced a similar fate. I have  
thus long delayed mentioning these facts because I will

never more fully your views were accepted by the House of  
Parliament: but said that forth before would have been  
have brought on the conversation and I am very sorry to see  
that the universal report in the world is both by those  
connected with ministers and by those of the opposite  
party that the Cabinet intended while meeting the Par-  
liament:

At present I shall not say any more but after the de-  
-cision on the Slave Trade is over, I want to speak for  
to you on the treatment and conduct of those who on  
their birth and continue in existence to you in  
believe me,
