Dear Mr,

In the course of the night I received
an express from Lord Castlereagh and send a copy of
it: between ten and eleven Lord William Pitt's
return with the answer from the Peace allied
Sovereigns which have most satisfactory to the Prime
Minister and most peculiarly pleasing consequent-
ly to myself: I send them copied: the Emperor
of Austria does not come and to my great joy and
satisfaction the Emperor of Russia and the King

of Peepia embark with me in this ship: their
writings are large but with activity and regularity
I shall arrange every thing: tomorrow I will send the
lists: I have sent for the Captains and the horses who
unless I receive fresh orders are directed to the Par-
-racks of the second life guards: I enclose a copy of
Charles Stewart's letter to me: I cannot conclude this
letter without expressing how very grateful I do
and must feel to the Prince: I repeat for bringing
me this forward: few very few individuals could
in one day receive these letters from crowned
heads: I trust with the assistance of Captain Black-
need and the indefatigable zeal of Captains

Adieu to de bonjour to my own. I am in and land
the allied Sovereigns under the most favorable
impression of British discipline and of the mag-
-nificence of my master: tell Bloomfield the
Emperor Desiré alone in France requires on the
road at each stage twenty Pair of horses: adieu
of till tomorrow when I shall send the lists and may
believe me,
